

#### Performer

#### Teacher

Susan's approach to teaching is a holistic one, drawing on baroque practice as well as knowledge from modern performance science.

#### Coach

Susan's elective courses on practice methods and performance preparation uses an approach based on two concepts: *The Musician as Instrument* and *Music as a Language*.

#### Researcher

Currently Susan is undergoing a doctoral study researching the effects of attentional focus on skill acquisition and on optimal performance.

# 3. The Articles

The Articles from 2022 are approved and "valid" for YMTE, but there is a need for further amendments and an upgrading of the Articles so that they are in accordance with the present and (foreseeable) future YMTE situation.

The Management Board therefore proposes that a Working Group – led by the MB Secretary, is established and given an assignment to go through the Articles and to present a new revision for approval at the next General Meeting. The MB asks the GM 2023 to suggest members to this WG.

Resolution: The GM approved to establish a Work Group for revising The Articles. The Work Group will present a new revision for approval by the General Meeting 2024.



# 4. Annual contributions - Membership fee for 2024

The MB proposes that the membership fee for 2024 is kept at 300 EUR pr/year.

Resolution: The membership fee for 2024 is 300 EUR pr. member organisation.




## 5. Suggestions from the Management Board for the GM 2024

- a. The MB had planned for a GM in March/April 2023 to comply with The Articles, and to separate the GM from the Annual Conference. Unfortunately, the plans had to be changed and the GM is once again included in the annual conference. The MB suggests Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> of April 2024 at 09.30 11.30 for next GM. The GM will be a zoom online meeting.
- b. As the Association grows so does also the duties and formal obligations. The MB recognises the growing amount of work, especially for the secretary function, and therefore suggests that the GM approve of the need of a general secretary/general manager/CEO. An appointment will be subject to the financial situation of the association. The MB will propose a model for approval by the GM 2024.
- c. The MB suggests that vacancies in the MB and the financial committee be filled by the GM 2024.

Resolution: The proposals were noted by the GM.

10 stages. Choice of exam or not each year

Free choice of repertoire, fixed tech, sightreading

External specialists (instrumentalists, not examiners) pluss teachers mark for the whole year.

Theory, aural

Stage 10 is BA 2<sup>nd</sup> year (7, 8, 9 and 10 are not compulsory)

#### **AEC-YMTE**

- Linking education levels and expectations, also lifelong learning.
- Learning outcomes (for children: when you are ready for it)
- Qualification framework
- Mapping of Europe systems
- Some systems (not necessary methodology) are good and could inspire.
- Using the AEC-network for reaching potential members.

• Differences in income for teaching at different levels? A music education is less worth than other grades in Germany. This is a topic that should be raised into the collaboration with AEC (HME is educating the music teachers...) and also through EMU.

#### **Advising pupils**

The main influence should be the teacher of the main subject.

Teachers should give more advise and also show interest in a wider perspective and holistic approach.

#### **Erasmus Applications**

Students should benefit from the program.

Music schools do not use the Erasmus program as much as they can/should.

Bureaucracy problem: definition of mobility in context of educational system -> Vocational education vs. General education.

Opportunities:

- -individual mobility
- -group mobility
- -job shadowing
- -small scale projects
- -large projects

# - YMTE's role in student related activities/Exchange and collaboration

#### YMTE:

- Is a strong supporter of European exchange and joint activities amongst our institutions and their students.
- Is an organization with a continuous focus on, and encouragement towards student related activities and exchange.
- Will organize the website so that it enables the sharing of information that is valuable for student activities and exchange and help contact between its member institutions.
- Establishes an ongoing WG for the purpose of exchange and student related activities.
- Can be initiating and/or confirming larger scale project. (Criteria must be worked out)
- Can facilitate a market place were we are helping each other realizing exchange or student related activities?
- YMTE as an organization is not responsible for producing projects on its own. There is always a host organization (one of the members) that is in charge, and includes other members in the most efficient way.
